## Education Ministry

### Children

#### **Preschool**

Children ages 2 through kindergarten, Sunday morning, 11:15 - 11:35 a.m. // Room 2

During their time together, preschoolers hear a Bible story, sing a song or make a craft, and say a prayer together. The activities are geared to preschoolers' learning styles and attention spans, and we also have a lot of fun together! After their 20-minute lesson, children play together until the end of the Sunday School time.

#### Elementary School

1st-5th graders, Sunday mornings, 11:15 a.m.-12:00 p.m. // Room 103

This year, elementary students are learning about God's big story in the Bible. Each week, we dive into a story from Scripture to see what it can teach us about who God is and who we are called to be. Here are the stories we'll be learning about in January and February:

January 5 – It's Epiphany! Let's Worship Jesus! (Matthew 2:1-12); January 12 – You Are My Beloved (Luke 3:1-22) January 19 – It's Tempting (Luke 4:1-13); January 26 – Good News! (Luke 4:14-21)

February 2 – Spreading the Good News (Luke 4:16-30); February 16 – Blessed Are... (Luke 6:17-26) February 23 – God's Way to Live (Luke 6:27-38)

#### Sunday Morning Small Groups

January 5, 12, 19, 26 // Youth Sunday Planning

Youth Sunday is coming up on Sunday, February 2, and we're spending the mornings in January getting ready for this special service. We'll spend time studying the Scripture passages for the day, developing a theme for the service, and writing liturgy. Youth will also have a chance to decide how they'd like to participate in the service itself, and there's room for everyone. We look forward to seeing how the Spirit guides us in our preparations!

February 2 - Youth Sunday Breakfast and Celebration

After the youth lead worship at 10:00 a.m., we'll have breakfast together and enjoy some fellowship time in the youth room.

February 16 - In the fall, we learned about God's big story in Scripture through the Echo the Story curriculum. This winter and spring, we'll learn about the stories of individual people of faith who were committed to God's love and justice for all people – even if it occasionally meant going against the status quo. Starting on February 16, we'll be using materials from a curriculum titled *We Are Made of Stories and Stardust*, and we'll hear a different person's story each week.

On February 16, we'll have our first lesson, titled "Let's Make Some Holy Trouble."

February 23 - On the fourth Sundays of the month between February and April, the youth will get to invite a guest from the congregation to come share their own stories and faith.

Confirmands will also have their monthly classes on the fourth Sundays of the month in January, February, March, and April, and they will meet in room 204 while the other youth meet in room 203.
