#### From Our Pastor

Over the summer, *The New York Times* published a list of "The 100 Best Books of the 21st Century." To create the list, the *Times* sent a survey to "hundreds of literary luminaries" and asked them to name the top ten books published since January 1, 2000. More than five hundred novelists, poets, non-fiction writers, and bibliophiles responded, and the resulting list was the source of much Internet-chatter for a few days in July.

Not surprisingly, people had strong feelings about the books on the list. To appease its opinionated readers, the *Times* created a survey for people to submit their own lists of the top ten books of the century so far. The readers' list included 39 books that were on the original list and 61 different titles.

If you've ever been part of a book club, then you know that books can be a great catalyst for spirited and meaningful discussion. As people of faith, we know that the same can be said of the Bible. The stories of Scripture are sources of comfort, challenge, and sometimes confusion. Engaging with God's story also helps us engage with the stories of our loved ones as well as the stories of people around the world. Stories create connection and cultivate compassion.

As you read this issue of the *Chimes*, I hope you'll notice the stories that God is writing through our church. There are stories of hope through our service with GAP and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. There are stories of growth through our preschool and our faith formation offerings. There are stories of healing as well stories of grief in our prayer requests. God's Spirit is present in each and every one of these stories, and it's a beautiful thing to be part of these stories together.

### Creation Care Corner

Have you ever considered switching beans for beef?

Livestock (especially cattle) are responsible for 18% of global greenhouse gas emissions, which is more than cars, planes, and all transportation sources combined. How do livestock contribute so much to greenhouse gases? Because of the tremendous demand for beef, there are about 1.5 billion cows on the planet. According to the U.N. almost 1/3 of land on earth is used to raise livestock or livestock feed. About 80% of deforestation in the Amazon forests has been for the purpose of cattle ranching. Those forests are cleared by burning, which releases carbon into the atmosphere, and reduces the rainforest available to absorb carbon dioxide. Fossil fuels are also used to produce fertilizer to grow the feed, in meat production, and in transporting meat. Cow gas and manure produce more than a third of all methane emissions, and methane is 25 times more powerful than carbon dioxide in its impact on global warming.

According to a 2016 study, individual contributions to greenhouse gas emissions can be reduced 63% by switching to a vegetarian diet. Many of us may not be willing to give up meat entirely, but there is a single change you could make that would have a high impact: substitute beans for beef. In 2017, a team of scientists calculated that if every American made this single change, it would dramatically reduce greenhouse gases and free up 42% of U.S. croplands.

Our family read about this study in 2017 and while we haven't given up beef completely, it is now a special occasion meal rather than a regular menu item. Consider joining us in making this change!

### 2024 Thank Offering of Presbyterian Women

The Thank Offering of Presbyterian Women will be received on September 8, 2024. This year, eight projects have been selected for funding. Grants have been awarded to:



- 1) Waniyeta Consulting of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, for education, teaching and direction to young mothers.
- 2) Voices of Jubilee, a program to benefit incarcerated youth and their families.
- 3) SAFEchild, which provides prevention and intervention services for at-risk children.
- 4) Forward Paths Foundation, which works to influence at-risk youth to complete high school, attain a work history and learn financial management skills.
- 5) Peace Promise, which provides advocacy, education and economic empowerment to survivors of sexual exploitation and human trafficking. Peace Promise provides employment to survivors, mentoring education and on-the-job training.
- 6) The Office of Immigration Issues of the Office of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church, to purchase software that will track legislation and improve users' ability to contact lawmakers.
- 7) Presbyterian Church in Congo Presbyterian Ministries with Vulnerable Children, which coordinates protection and care for at-risk children.
- 8) Higgins Brothers' Surgicenter for Hope in Haiti, for an ambulance to transport rural patients to the Surgicenter and help with transporting health care workers.
