## From Our Pastor

I've often said from the pulpit that it is hard for those of us who live in the relative comfort of an affluent democracy to really understand the longing of Advent. When you have plenty to eat, feel safe, and live in a comfortable home, then why would you want a messiah to come into the world? This fall, we got a glimpse of that Advent longing when we had holes in our roofs, no power or internet, and an inability to get to the grocery store. "Come, Lord Jesus, and save us from all that would harm us!" Perhaps we can remember some of those moments as we begin the season of Advent together.

While many of you are still cleaning up and rebuilding after the storm, I'm happy to report that our recovery continues to go well here at Covenant. In November, we had many volunteers working to temporarily reestablish half of our playground for the preschool. The Session appointed the Playground Task Force to create and implement a plan for a new playground in 2025. Serving on this task force are Jim Buckalew, Andy Cooke, Katelyn Gordon Cooke, Dalton Cooper, Jill Reeves Garren, Chloe James, and Tara Swim. Of these seven, six of us are preschool parents and four are on the session. I am excited about what this group will do in the coming year!

We will also be getting roof repairs in early December. Tree and stump work are ongoing, as well as debris removal. We have reestablished most outdoor lighting, which makes the property much more navigable in the evenings. Other smaller repairs may not begin until the new year. On December 7, we will have a church workday from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. We hope that you can join us for that as we continue to clean up the property.

Finally, I want to say how excited I am about the class of incoming officers that you elected at the congregational meeting on November 17. Please join me in praying for Jimmy Carson, Dalton Cooper, Jeff Heck, Amy House, David Ross, Lindsay Southwell, and Debbie van Tuyll as they prepare to serve as deacons and elders at Covenant. Officer training will be in January. The officer retreat is February 7-8, and they will be ordained and installed on that Sunday, February 9, during worship.

Even as we long for the Messiah this Advent—even in the midst of pain and loss—we still have much to be excited about here at Covenant. I'm grateful to each of you for this ministry we share and for the community that God has given us.

### Undue Medical Debt

This past summer, the Matthew 25 Task Force challenged the congregation to raise \$10,000, alongside Westminster Presbyterian (Waynesboro) and Christ Presbyterian, to abolish medical debt for those being burdened by it in our

community. We exceeded our goal and raised \$10,077. Working the organization Undue Medical Debt, we were able to purchase over \$1.8 million in medical debt affecting 1,945 people in eleven counties in the CSRA!
